Boundless Domain of Artists Defined at Burchfield Exhibit

Coinciding with the beginning of United Nations Week in Buffalo, the first Burchfield International Exhibition was opened Monday evening at a reception for international students in the Burchfield Center at Buffalo State University College.

With flags of England, France, Canada and the Republic of Panama displayed over Burchfield paintings on loan from their owners in those countries for the exhibit, Dr. Kenneth Winebrenner, Buffalo State professor of art and member of the Burchfield Center Advisory Committee, said.

"The artist and the philosopher cross the international boundary line with every significant expression and, in effect, become citizens of the world, for truth and true greatness cannot be found within the boundaries of one's own state."

Mrs. Armand Jacobs, chairman of the UNICEF Committee

of the Buffalo Council on World Affairs presented a box of UNICEF greeting cards to the widow of the late Charles E. Burchfield, bearing reproductions of the renowned Garden-ville artist's painting "Orion in Winter."

Mayor Sedita and Wayne Wisbaum, president of the council, with their remarks opened U. N. Week in Buffalo.

Mrs. Dann Stevens of the Junior Board of the council, welcomed the students, all of whom are attending area schools.

Mrs. James H. Richter, chairman of the Buffalo State College Council, welcomed the audience of about 200 persons, and Dr. E. K. Fretwell Jr., State president, as master of ceremonies.

The show, continuing through Feb. 16, is sponsored by the Junior Board, Buffalo State and the World Affairs Council's UNICEF Committee.

Loot Is \$5000 In Burglary at Candy Company

Burglars made a \$5000 overnight haul in Queen City Candy Co., 396 Broadway, police reported Monday.
